Protecting "Maynard's Pond"


In 1955, a 5-acre spring-fed pond was dug by Luther Maynard to water dairy cows and irrigate crops. Known as "Maynard's Pond," it was built based on a design in use for watering cattle at a research farm at what was then called N.C. State College.



Once surrounded by forests and fields, Maynard's Pond had a 6-foot standpipe with an outlet on the back side of the dam where a spillway was located for emergency use.

Throughout the decades, members of our homeowners association have worked with the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality to regularly inspect the dam, evaluate its stability, and fund necessary repairs.

The North Carolina Dam Safety Program provides oversight to more than 3,000 dams statewide, working to provide for the certification and inspection of dams to: reduce the risk of dams failing, prevent property damage, personal injury, and loss of reservoir storage.



Today, the biggest concern is **continued erosion** along the dam crest and shrinking berm areas. Prohibiting access to the dam for fishing will minimize potential damage to these fragile areas. New signs will be going up soon. You can help by informing visitors and residents on the importance of **fishing in designated places** only.

It Takes a Village

In 1989, approximately 25 homeowners formed an association in response to the pond being put up for public auction. Pledging \$1000 per household, these residents were committed to purchasing and preserving the pond we enjoy today. Attractive to developers, the pond site drew several bidders during a series of public auctions. Ultimately, the association was successful in petitioning the Town of Cary to re-zone the pond to a **Resource and**Conservation District preventing any prospective owner from draining the pond and developing apartments or condominiums on the site.
